We know miracles happen on a Kairos weekend. Everyone serving in Kairos has witnessed the hearts of residents and volunteers softening and actually changing during the Weekend.

I recently read a short paragraph on the Kairos International website I want to share with you:

*The Kairos method of talks, meditations, individual group activities is an invitation to live in a personal relationship with the living Christ. Kairos is not only to help Christ in saving souls, but to put human lives in service — literally to transform prison environments.*

# Financial News

## What the new financial policies of Kairos Prison Ministry International mean for Georgia

*"In order to prepare Kairos Prison Ministry International for future growth opportunities it is important for the ministry to have an annual audit of the financial records on a ministry wide basis. To help prepare the ministry for the audit, and build consistency and accountability into the financial record keeping at the state level, the document titled, Ministry Financial Policies and Practices, is adopted, dated 1/20/06."*

This statement was taken from the Kairos Financial Policy and Procedures Manual found on the International website <kairosprisonministry.org>. Kairos International is making it easier and more efficient for Kairos of Georgia to grow. They have put forth very clear and concise procedures for us to follow, so that all states are keeping and reporting complete, accurate, and consistent financial records. Georgia will join with the rest of the ministry in following these new procedures.

### **State Chapter Treasurer responsibilities:**

1. Receive donations.
2. Deposit currency in bank.
3. Provide deposit slips and bank receipts to Financial Secretary.
4. Upon receipt of disbursement authorization from the Financial Secretary, sign and mail checks. Send copy of checks and supporting documentation to Financial Secretary noting date check was mailed.
5. Provide training to Advisory Council Treasurers.

### **State Financial Secretary responsibilities:**


1. Receives all invoices, requests for reimbursements, and requests for advances.
2. Verify the expenditure is in accordance with International's Policies and Practices. If it is not, contacts the State Committee Chair for disposition of the charge or request.

3. Enter all data into Quickbooks. Create checks with supporting documentation to send to State Treasurer.
4. Reconcile receipt logs and deposits.
5. Send an IRS acceptable letter for all donations received through the State Chapter.
6. Maintain all records for five years.
7. Reconcile bank statement.
8. Prepare annual budget for approval by State Committee.
9. Provide training to Advisory Council Financial Secretaries.

We commit to make deposits and reimburse expenses expeditiously.

We will be contacting each Advisory council in regard to a new computer software program that will allow each council to keep track of their financial data. It keeps a record of donors, it generates thank you letters with IRS data and it generates financial reports that can be sent to the State Financial Secretary electronically. Each advisory council should have a Treasurer and Financial Secretary to properly implement this program. It is not necessary that these volunteers have accounting or bookkeeping training or experience. The Donor program is easy to use, and training will be available. This is a great opportunity for advisory councils to gain control of their finances. Please join with us as we move forward in 2008 with a new commitment to God and our beloved Kairos.

The Kairos Weekend is bathed in Agape – the unconditional love of Christ, delivered by the people of Christ. One of the key responsibilities of the Team is to understand the critical nature of Agape and to ensure that proper preparations are being made to connect the greater Body of Christ to the opportunity for communicating that love to the Participants on the Kairos Weekend (Prog. Man. p.III-31).

Agape, as used in Kairos, is the offering of unconditional love to another person with no expectation of receiving anything in return. It is

wanting the very best for another person and being willing to be used by God to move them toward that “best” without regard to personal sacrifice. This is done in our prayers for the participants represented in the form of prayer chains, letters, posters, food, cookies, money, etc. Kairos offers a wonderful opportunity to help Christians respond to Christ’s calling by communicating His love through their gifts of Agape.

Basically the AGAPE COORDINATOR’S JOB is to gather and receive the prayers of visible Agape from all people and deliver it to the addressee — the Kairos Team Agape Coordinator who presents it to the Kairos Participants. One should be aware that this Job can consume all of your free time if allowed. Plan your work and work your plan.

The [www.kairosprisonministry.org](http://www.kairosprisonministry.org) Web Site Kairos Kalendar is used for dates and data on Kairos Events world wide. The Advisory Council Agape Coordinators should be aware of how to use this to inform the Prison Kairos Inside (Inmate) Agape Coordinator with print outs on Kairos events.

The Web Site also is the source of the Agape Coordinator Chairman’s address, phone no., and email address for other States and Countries.

The K/GA Agape Coor. Chair is responsible for sending the Kairos Weekend schedules to Kairos Int’l to be listed in the Kalendar.

The K/GA Secretary is the initial source of the schedules. However, some Kairos Teams have trouble with reporting. You must phone the Adv. Cncl Chairman to get the dates at least two months in advance.

Personal Agape is welcomed except for Colorado Prisons and Kairos Outside where only Poster Agape is accepted. All Agape produced through the GA Prison Kairos Inside (Inmate) Coor. for K/GA Prisons is to be sent from the Prison Chaplain’s Office to other Prison Chaplain’s Offices. This is working well and the GDOC Chaplaincy is using it.

The Kairos Team Leader has instructions to give the K/GA Agape Coor. Chair the name, address and phone no. of the current Kairos Team Agape Coor. to whom Agape may be deliver. You may have to phone for it. Day by day Agape activity is similar to that of a mini Post Office.

Find a friendly Church willing to allow you to make free copies using your purchased pastel mixed multi color copy paper. Print 25 sets (100-200pp) of Agape, five sets each week or so for each K/GA semester. All paper poster Agape can be folded and mailed in envelopes. Poster board Agape may be rolled, taped and mailed without a tube. Mail Agape, at least three weeks in advance of the Kairos date. That received late may be mailed First Class for on time delivery or hold it for next Kairos. Agape received late may be delivered by using the Web Site to find the (State) Dept. of Corrections USPS address and sending it Attn: Kairos Leader, c/o Chaplain’s Office, Prison name and address. This may also be necessary for a prison that is not in the Agape Coordinator listing on the Kairos Web Site.

After being in this ministry for some 6 years plus we are so encouraged by the changes Christ has made in the lives of many young princes and princesses of God. As much as we all value money, it will not open the YDC's at Eastman, Macon, Columbus, Milledgeville, Augusta, etc. What is needed more than anything is volunteers who are lead by God to join us in this critical time for our young people. # Kairos Outside

Kairos Outside is designed to support the wives, mothers, female relatives and friends of men and women who are, or have been, incarcerated. This is done over a 3 day weekend (most of our guests cannot afford to take an extra day off work for the normal 4 day weekend, as they are the primary bread-winners for their families). The weekend gives our guests an opportunity to interact with other women in similar situations, who also have felt isolated and rejected. Time and time again we have heard our guests saying "I thought I was the only one going through this" We believe that the women are "doing time" right along with their loved ones. Through a series of talks given by the team members, they are able to relate, to see how God has and will always be the Rock they can cling to. We love on them, give them Agape gifts through-out the Weekend, (including Teddy Bears!), announce them individually after they each receive a crown and a rose at a Saturday evening formal dinner. After the forgiveness service, the community is there with lit candles and singing to them as our guests make their way from the chapel to the cafeteria. We give them beautiful flowers early Sunday morning as we awaken them with singing, not to mention being waited on by our kitchen team with wonderful food and skits to make them laugh.

The hi-light of the Weekend is getting a "Special Letter" Sunday morning from their loved one. It's like the individual is sitting right next to them. This is a very emotional time for them ... and us!!

We do not charge our guests a cent for coming and over the years we've also helped out with their transportation to get them to the Weekend. Our teams are made up of anywhere between 50 and 65 women (1/3 are former guests and, because of provided "scholarships," all are able to work if they choose to) and men (the men *only* work in the kitchen). People *pay* to work this weekend, plus we try to raise money from friends, past team members, our churches and other sources. Normal Weekend expenses are approximately \$5,000, this includes the camp facilities, needed supplies, bears, flowers and food.

At each closing ceremony, we always hear how much the Weekend has impacted and blessed our guests; they can now go home filled with "Joy for The Journey"!

We have 2 Kairos Outside locations for our guests to choose from.

Upcoming Weekends are #4 April 4-6 in South GA, P.O. Box 367, Arlington GA 39813, and # 21 April 11-13 in North GA, P.O. Box 1291, Duluth GA 30096.

By being told about this, this *is* the ultimate gift someone incarcerated can give their loved one.

Kairos volunteers are very aware of this fact. Please search your hearts and contact us if you are willing to help in any way.

Jim Mauldin has just finished two years as Chairman of the Georgia State Committee. For one reason and another, they were not an easy two years. But Jim is faithful. I tell him sometimes, “This is not the fun part.” Maybe so. But running the State Committee is the necessary part so that the rest of us can have the fun of being on a Kairos team and doing weekends and all that. Jim is a servant of the Lord and deserves all honor for his service. He is still my hero, and he is my friend.

My friend Tom Crankshaw has served Kairos in Georgia as much as any man I know. Tom was State Treasurer during the really hard financial times just a few years ago when we didn’t know if we were going to have to cancel weekends simply because we didn’t know where the money would
